Our recent Interschool sports fixture was a resounding success. Last week, we hosted Kawaha Point, and our students had a fantastic time, securing victories across all five codes and creating awesome memories. This afternoon, we look forward to another exciting exchange against Kaharoa School. I am confident it will be equally successful.



You may have seen recent news about declining nationwide results in Maths and Literacy. According to the latest data from the Curriculum Insights and Progress Study (CIPS), only 22% of Year 8 students across New Zealand are meeting the expected curriculum benchmarks for mathematics. I want to reassure you that our results at Ngongotaha School are significantly better. Currently, 78% of our students are performing at or above their expected level 2% short of MOE target for achievement. With continued effort, we anticipate that 85-90% of our students will reach their goals by the end of the year. Additionally, we are implementing the Government's Structured Literacy program, which is currently being used in our junior school and will be extended to the senior school next year. We are also preparing to roll out the Structured Numeracy approach once the Government finalizes its framework for 2025.

In recent years, we've been fortunate to have Sayaka Yamada (Tyga and Phenix's mum) visit the school twice a week. Sayaka has been instrumental in teaching Japanese language and origami skills to groups of children during lunchtimes. The children thoroughly enjoy their time with Sayaka and have learned a great deal from her. If you have a skill—whether it's language, knitting, art, sport, or anything else—and would like to volunteer to run a lunchtime club, please get in touch with us. We're eager to make it happen!

This service is free and will enable the public to more easily access Head Lice and Scabies treatments without prescription and also remove cost-related barriers. No appointments are needed. The person needing the treatment or their parent/s can just come into our pharmacy and ask for the consultation and the pharmacist will provide a private room for the short consult, where the pharmacist will check the symptoms, ask a few relevant questions, determine if the product is suitable and provide the relevant product with advice, or refer to doctor if needed. For the Headlice service, we are able to provide 1 bottle of Head Lice treatment lotion and a lice comb for each person in the household needing treatment. For the Scabies service, we are able to provide 2 bottles of Anti-scabies lotion for each person in the household, plus a tube of anti-itch cream if needed.

The service is completely free of charge and in addition to the products, relevant information leaflets will be provided.
